Week 3: 7/15-7/19 **WIMNI Olympics**

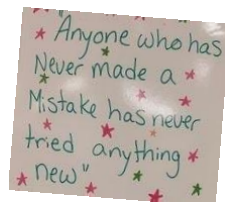

Week 4: 7/22-7/26 **Outdoor Adventures**

Explore local walking, hiking, and nature paths and learn about native plants and animals and about the history of Highland Park and New Brunswick.

Week 5: 7/29-8/2 **Science Week**

Science during summer break? Don't worry; we'll make it fun! We'll perform simple experiments done with everyday items, learn



about the science of the world around us, and learn about famous scientists who call(ed) New Jersey home.

Week 6: 8/5-8/9 **Theatre Week**

It's time to take center stage! This week will be spent creating a play—from the plot to the characters to the costumes...and everything in between. (If all goes well, there will be a performance for parents/caregivers at the end of the week.)

Week 7: 8/12-8/16 **Farm Fun**

NJ is called the “Garden State” because of the role farming and agriculture play in the state's economy. Discussions and activities this week will focus on the different kinds of farms that can be found throughout the state. We'll talk about the different fruits and vegetables that are grown here, the first-ever Christmas tree farm that was started outside of Trenton, and why horses are so important to NJ.

Week 8: 8/19-8/23 **Bugs!**

Did you know you can find thousands of types of insects in NJ, including tiger beetles, spotted lantern flies, Monarch butterflies, ladybugs, and wheel bugs? We'll learn about the official state insect of NJ, talk about which insects hurt the environment, and which are helpful.
